


Career-Life Balance Initiatives Town Hall Meetings

Monday Session

Data collected by MPOWIR (Mentoring Physical Oceanography Women to Increase Retention) over the past four years indicates that 46% of women see balancing work and family as 'nearly impossible' or 'impossible', with only 24% of women rating it as 'possible' or 'very possible'. While these views are sobering, NSF's recent announcement of the Career-Life Balance Initiative and the rise in mentoring networks are promising signs. At this Town Hall sponsored by MPOWIR and AWIS (Association for Women in Science), invited speakers will discuss institutional and personal avenues toward achieving this balance. A panel discussion will follow.
