One of the missions of NASA and JPL's Center for Climate Sciences is to improve climate models through the use of observations of Earth obtained from satellites. In keeping with this mission, NASA and the Center for Climate Sciences are proud to sponsor a second Climate Science Summer School this August.

The Summer School will bring together the next generation of climate scientists – about 30 graduate students and postdocs – and climate experts from NASA and other national and international organizations. Students will explore how satellite observations can be used to evaluate and improve climate models, and will hear from a range of speakers on climate model diagnostics and evaluation and remote sensing of the planet.

All students' travel and accommodation expenses will be paid for by NASA and the JPL Climate Center. **The application deadline is Friday, July 6, 2012.** Places are limited.
