



## Tenure-Track Faculty Position in Climate Dynamics

The successful applicant will be expected to develop an active research program, supervise graduate students, and teach a variety of undergraduate and graduate courses.

A Ph. D. in atmospheric or oceanic sciences or a closely related field is required.
