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TENURE TRACK POSITION IN PHYSICAL OCEANOGRAPHY

San Francisco State University's (SF State) Department of Geosciences (<http://tornado.sfsu.edu/>) seeks candidates for a tenure-track position in Physical Oceanography at the Assistant Professor level to begin in August 2013. A Ph.D. in Oceanography is required, and postdoctoral experience is preferred. We seek a scientist committed to furthering the understanding of physical processes in the ocean and/or near-shore environment. The ideal candidate will have interdisciplinary research interests and experience in areas such as coastal and estuarine circulation, air-sea interaction, or large-scale phenomena such as global climate change. Salary for this position is to be negotiated and will be commensurate with experience.

Applicants must demonstrate the ability to develop an outstanding, externally-funded research program involving undergraduate and graduate students. The successful candidate must have a commitment to excellence in teaching—with teaching interests or experience in the areas of physical oceanography, estuarine processes, and/or ocean-related climate studies—and will be expected to teach at the undergraduate and graduate levels. Opportunities for collaboration exist at a variety of marine stations associated with SF State (e.g., Romberg Tiburon Center—<http://rtc.sfsu.edu>) and the larger community.
